Year 12 Child Studies Excursion

Today our Year 12 Child Studies class travelled to Adelaide to visit the South Australian School and Services for Vision Impaired (SASSVI). As part of their learning, the Year 12s visited SASVI to learn about the particular needs of the students in their facility and to observe and interact with the children before they develop a learning aid that will support them. The Year 12s will also do some shopping while they are in Adelaide to purchase any items required to make their learning aid. This experience aligns itself with our Catholic values and commitment to helping others. In the past it has served our students well and supported them to achieve excellent results in Stage 2 Child Studies.



Senior Citizen Club Visits

Throughout this term, a number of classes have visited the Senior Citizens Club. Students in Years 5, 6 and 8 participated in these visits for the purpose of talking to new people, engaging in some friendly games of lawn bowls and cards, and sharing life experiences. Our Choir also visited the Senior Citizens Club and loved performing for them. These visits connect with our Social and Emotional Learning curriculum and allows students to develop a range of social and interpersonal skills. Importantly, we also see this as an excellent opportunity to be present in our local community.



On Wednesday we held a VET Information Evening for our Year 10 students and their families in preparation for next year. Mrs Susy Rogers supported our students and families to learn and understand more about potential VET pathways. This was an important part of the process for supporting students with their learning and interests as they explore possible learning and career pathways for the coming years. Our school boasts a proud record of students accessing VET as part of their schooling journey. Last year, over 40% of our Year 12 students successfully completed their SACE taking advantage of a vocational educational training (VET) pathway.



Bus Information

It is important for students and families to be aware of the expectations for safe and responsible behaviours on the buses before and after school. While the bus is not operated by the school, we expect our students, who represent our College by virtue of wearing the school uniform, to uphold the same positive behaviours as they do at school. To support the safe and comfortable transit to and from school, students who utilise the bus service will be meeting with school leadership to re-establish expectations and procedures around bus use. Further information will be communicated directly to those families whose children access this service.

After School Use of Playground

We enjoy seeing some of our students and families gather and play together on the playground adjacent to the Penola Learning Centre (R-3 building) after school. It is a convenient space for families to converge at the end of the school day. The playground is not supervised by a teacher after school, so to ensure everyone's safely we ask for parents/caregivers to be aware of the following:

- Students and younger children need to be directly supervised by a parent/caregiver on the playground after school.
- The Nature Play Area is out-of-bounds after school.
- The Crossing Monitors generally finish their duty at approx. 3:10pm. We kindly ask families to be off school premises by this time, so they can cross the road safely while the Crossing Monitors are still on duty.

RYPEN is a three-day residential program of enrichment for young people aged 14 to 17.

The program aims to provide opportunities for young people to develop important life-skills, and to assist them to progress their communication and leadership skills through a range of formal and informal activities.

Participants take part in a range of activities including:

- Small group work
- Workshops
- Career expos

Beliefs and values

RYPEN'S focus is on assisting young people to become active and valuable members of society, and to develop their abilities as potential leaders.

Participants can seize the opportunity to develop leadership, communication and problem-solving skills, practice new behaviours, forge life-long friendships and challenge their personal belief systems and values.

Who is Eligible?

RYPEN is open to all young people aged 14 to 17 years who have an ambition to improve their interpersonal and leadership skills.

Details in Brief

- When / Where: RYPEN is held at Nunyara Conference Centre between Fri 1 Nov and Sun 3 Nov 2024.
- How to register: Any young person aged 14-17 can register their interest at www.rypen9510.org
- Applications are due: Monday 14 October 2024.
- RYPEN costs: Around \$425, but most young people will attend at no cost, fully sponsored by Rotary. Rotary Clubs may request a \$50 holding deposit which is fully refundable when the young person attends RYPEN.
- School involvement: Encourage young people to apply. Once a young person registers, Rotary finds a local Rotary Club to sponsor the applicant.
- Rotary involvement: Based on each applicant's registration details, their local Rotary Club will contact the student directly. The club may interview the applicant and ask to interview the applicant.
- Child Protection: RYPEN facilitators are aged between 19 and 24, have attended Rotary leadership training, have their Working With Children Check (WWCC) and have been vetted for suitability by Rotary.

STUDENT HEALTH & WELLBEING



To prioritise the wellbeing of our students with ongoing medical conditions such as asthma, anaphylaxis, or diabetes, we require a current health care plan from your child's General Practitioner (GP).

If your child requires medication to be dispensed during school hours (including prescription pharmaceuticals and antibiotics), our First Aid Officers can administer these provided that a Medication Agreement for Education and Care Form is completed by your child's GP and is on file. Please note that our First Aid Officers are unable to dispense medication without this form.

To comply with legal requirements, all medical forms must be updated annually. We kindly request your GP to provide updated details that align with the best practices for first aid treatment of your child's specific condition(s).
